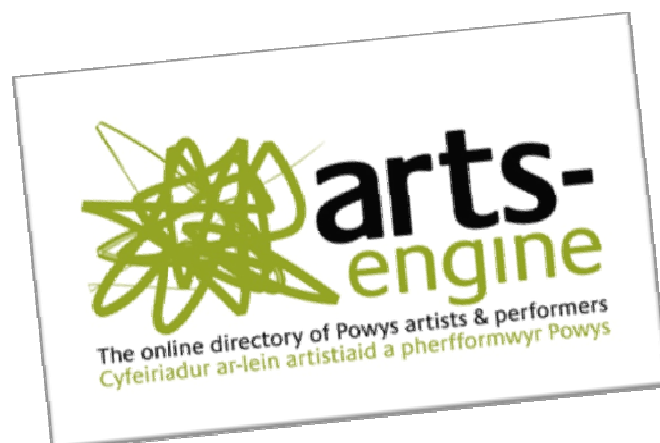

Creating a PDF

Creating a PDF from a text or image document is not a complex process and you do not need a full version of Adobe Acrobat or other Adobe software to create a PDF document.

This document is designed to provide you with a brief overview as to the various solutions available which will allow you to convert your existing documents to a PDF and point you in the direction as to the most popular products available both FREE and Commercial.

The FREE Options ...

If you are looking to create a PDF document from a pre-existing document such as a word or publisher document then by downloading and installing one of the available **FREE** PDF creators you can easily convert the file to PDF by choosing to “Print to PDF” in the same way as you would choose to print the document via your normal printer.

You can easily print images and other graphical documents in the same way, although as you are “printing” the document you will have to understand that there might be certain limitations. If you can cope with the limitation, or you are prepared to try out various settings to establish what you can and can't do, then you should be able to convert documents to PDF for **FREE!**

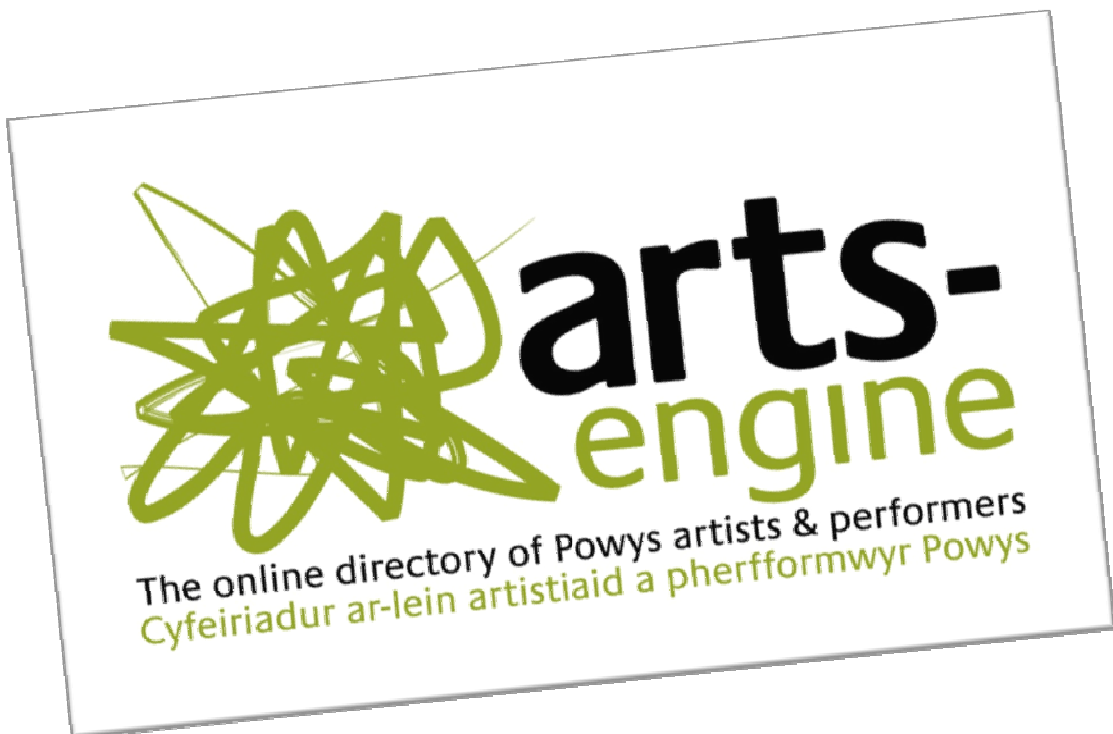

If you do want a little bit more flexibility in the PDF creation then there are alternatives to Adobe Acrobat. Nitro PDF is one of the most common alternatives and does provide the ability to create PDF's from a variety of document formats at a fraction of the cost of the full Adobe Software.
